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# Project Description

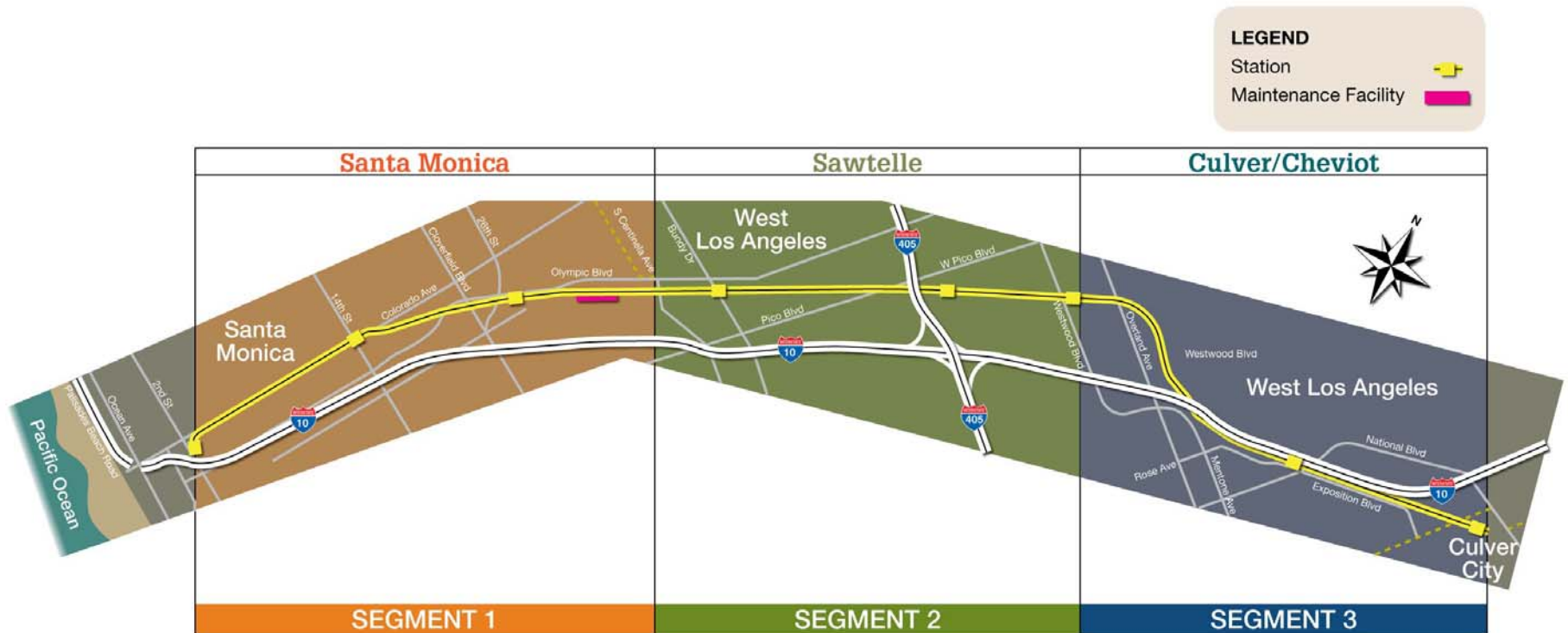
Upon completion of the Expo Line, Los Angeles area residents will have the option of using light rail travel between downtown Los Angeles and Santa Monica. Currently under construction, the 15.2 mile Expo Line will bring light rail to the Exposition Corridor, with 19 stations serving destinations like USC, Exposition Park, the Mid-City Communities, the Crenshaw District, Culver City, West Los Angeles and Santa Monica.

Phase 1 of the line travels from downtown Los Angeles to Culver City, and Phase 2 will extend the line to Santa Monica. Service on Phase 1 is expected to begin in late 2011, with service to the Venice/Robertson station in 2012. The line is scheduled to be complete in 2015 with the Santa Monica opening.

With construction of Phase 1 of the Expo Line almost complete, the SkanskaRados Expo 2 Joint Venture (SRJV) has been selected by the Exposition Metro Line Construction Authority as the design-build contractor for Phase 2. SRJV is currently in the design phase of Phase 2, with construction scheduled to start in 2012.

Harris & Associates is the Consultant to SRJV for community outreach, L/SBE outreach and the Local Hire program.

# SBE Eligibility Requirements

**For this project, A SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE is defined as a firm certified as a Small Business concern by one of the following entities:**

- **California Department of General Services (DGS) SBE – Procurement Division (PD).**

Eligibility: A business with 100 or fewer employees and average annual gross receipts of \$14,000,000 or less over the previous three (3) years or a manufacturer with 100 or fewer employees.

- **Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro)**

Eligibility: A business that meets the size standards set by the Small Business Administration by primary NAICS Code and whose owners have a Personal Net Worth of \$1,320,000 or less.

- **Firms certified as a Disadvantage Business Enterprise (DBE's) by a California Unified Certification Program (CUCP) certifying agency.**

Eligibility: A business with average annual gross receipts of \$22,410,000 or less over the previous three (3) years, that meet the size standards set by SBA by primary NAICS Code, and whose owners have a Personal Net Worth of \$1,320,000 or less and meet DBE Social and Economic Disadvantage criteria.

**A LOCAL SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE is defined as a certified small business concern whose business is located within Los Angeles County**

# Qualifying your Workers as Community Area Resident Hires

**Companies employing craft workers for Phase 2 are required to meet Community/ Local Hire goals established by the Expo Authority.**

**GOAL** – A minimum of 30 percent of all craft hours of project work are to be performed by Community Area Residents and Local Residents, with priority given to Community Area Residents. A minimum of 10 percent or one-third (1/3) of the 30 percent shall be Disadvantaged Workers.

**Community Area Resident** – An individual whose primary place of residence is the County of Los Angeles and is within the Authority determined project impact area, bound by a 5-mile radius from Downtown Los Angeles to Santa Monica.

**Disadvantaged Worker** – An individual whose primary place of residence is within the County and who, prior to commencing work on the project, either (a) has a household income of less than 50 percent of the Area Median Income or (b) faces at least one of the following barriers to employment: being homeless; a custodial single parent; receiving public assistance; lacking a GED or high school diploma; having a criminal record or other involvement with criminal justice system; or suffering from chronic unemployment.

# Qualifying your Workers as Local Hire Workers

**Companies employing craft workers for Phase 2 are required to meet Community/Local Hire goals established by the Expo Authority.**

**GOAL** – A minimum of 30 percent of all craft hours of project work are to be performed by Community Area Residents and Local Residents, with priority given to Community Area Residents. A minimum of 10 percent or one-third (1/3) of the 30 percent shall be Disadvantaged Workers.

**Local Area Resident** – An individual whose primary place of residence is within the County and is within a zip code containing at least part of one census tract with a rate of unemployment in excess of 150 percent of the Los Angeles County unemployment rate, as reported by the State of California Development Department, and as determined and provided by the Authority.
